





"Mubanga, you have the biggest head in this class and yet you are the dumbest!!"

I still remember those words from my 7th-grade Math tutor. I could hear my friends just laughing at me, and I became very embarrassed. I didn't know what to do. My older sister began to take matters into her own hands, waking me up at 4 in the morning to study. While I can still remember the stress of those days, what I learned when I began to study would forever change my life. Mathematics began to mold me into who I am today. Later on, I discovered how Mathematics can assist in building character, creating order, and how numbers are used in prophecy. I would like to share a summary of this knowledge with you in hopes that you will also see the necessity of Math.

When you think of character you think of what a person does on a constant basis. When you think of God, it is inevitable that your mind goes to the fact that He is merciful, and can never lie. When you think of your mother, you might think of her as kind, affectionate, and understanding. These attributes do not exist in a vacuum but are a direct result of decisions that are made.

When you decide to study Math, it will teach you discipline.

Although it takes effort to sit down - amidst the distractions of life - and study, you won't only be acquiring the skills needed to understand Math, but you will also be training yourself to have a *CHARACTER* that is driven by principle.

M4TH3M4TIC5: GOD'S TOOL FOR CHARACTER BUILDING

"Mathematics is the alphabet with which God has written the universe." ~Galileo Galilei

Once you have decided that you are going to study instead of doing your favorite pastime, you need to understand that there are steps that must be followed. Just like when you answer Math problems, if you don't follow those steps, you will not get the correct answers. The first step can be done simply - get a sheet of paper and write down your study schedule for the day. Planning and working the plan has proven very beneficial, so much so that it is even in the Bible when God orchestrated the "watches" for people to ORDER their day around the times to pray. Implementing this step-by-step process will lead to a well-ordered Math problem and a well-ordered life.

IS THERE A CONNECTION BETWEEN **MATH** AND THE **ADVENTIST FAITH?**

As you reflect on order, let's consider the numbers that are all around us. There are 7 days in a week, 365 days in a year, 300 bones in a baby, and 206 bones in an adult. God even thought of the precise number of petals on a flower! The list is endless when you begin to observe our world. Imagine if you had 3 legs, 2 heads, and 6 eyes!! You can see that numbers create structure and order. God even used numbers to communicate an important message to us. This is what has formed the foundation of the Adventist faith - the 2300-day Prophecy. God is the Master Mathematician and He has used numbers since the inception of our world.

These are the lessons that I learned as I began to understand Math more deeply. Recently, I was able to reconnect with the very same tutor that embarrassed me in 7th grade. I was able to thank him for his wake-up call. After his tutoring with me, I went on to graduate with straight A's. What made the change? I was able to maximize the opportunities and time that God entrusted me with to order my life. As I did this, I grew, I learned, and my character changed.

"Strive to enter in at the strait gate: for many, I say unto you, will seek to enter in, and shall not be able."


What this verse means is that we should strive to be in the Kingdom of God - to be with Jesus in the clouds with all the Saints of Christ.
