I started with a negative mindset, but my teacher told me something that stuck with me: "Once you change your perspective and attitude towards science, you will begin to like it." I decided to try—and it worked.

This year, I've come to love science, especially Biology. Lessons on Macromolecules and the Cell were my favorites, and I'm grateful for a teacher who truly cares. Biology and Chemistry have sparked a passion in me and helped me discover a career path I never imagined before.

One of the biggest challenges was our final project on health reform—I struggled to understand the "why." But it pushed me to think deeper, especially in light of 1 Peter's call to stand firm in our beliefs. To anyone struggling with a subject: shift your perspective and give it a chance. You might end up loving it. And always remember—studying is key."

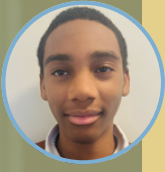

GRADUATES' YEAR IN REFLECTION

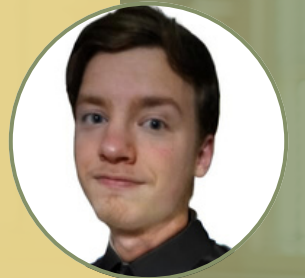

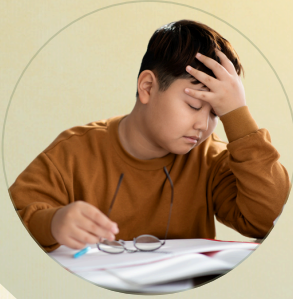
ANGELA PARTIDA

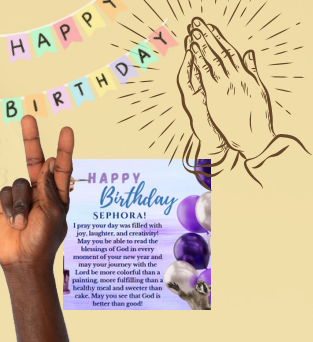

BALANCING BOOKS AND BELIEFS:

A HOMESCHOOL STUDENT'S PERSPECTIVE ON HEALTHY LIVING

As a homeschool student learning online through 3 Angels Academy, the challenge isn't running between school and a part-time job—it's balancing screen time, study schedules, spiritual life, and staying healthy while being at home most of the day. What I've learned is that healthy living is not just about avoiding junk food or getting enough sleep. **It's about creating harmony between mind, body, and soul.**

Ellen G. White's book **Healthful Living** has become a foundational guide in helping me stay grounded in a lifestyle that promotes not just survival, but true vitality. Her counsel is not outdated—it is timeless. She says, **"Perfect health depends upon perfect circulation."** That statement alone challenged me to reconsider my sedentary lifestyle of sitting for hours in front of a screen. I realized that regular movement—taking short breaks to stretch, doing chores between classes, or spending time outdoors—could improve both my focus and mood.

White also emphasizes the importance of fresh air and sunlight, something many of us overlook while indoors most of the day. I started doing morning devotionals outside whenever possible. Not only did this feed my spiritual life, but it also allowed me to soak in sunlight and breathe in fresh air—two powerful, natural healers that cost nothing but offer everything.

Academically, it's easy to fall into the trap of late nights and screen overload, but **Healthful Living** reminds us that **"early to bed and early to rise"** is more than an old saying—it's a divine prescription. When I began sleeping earlier, my mental clarity improved. I retained information better, and my stress levels went down. I was living proof that obedience to natural law is obedience to God's law.

In balancing spiritual life with studies, I found that prioritizing time with God actually made me more efficient. Ellen White writes, **"It is the first duty of every rational being to learn the will of God for**

him, and to obey it." When I made morning worship a non-negotiable habit—even with lessons to complete—I experienced peace that surpassed understanding and productivity that surprised even me....

From a dietary standpoint, the push toward plant-based eating that White advocated long before it was trendy helped me break free from the grip of processed foods. Simple, whole foods—fruits, vegetables, grains, nuts—fuel my brain and body. Preparing meals at home with my family has become a part of our daily rhythm, bringing us closer together and helping me stay energized throughout the day.

Healthy living for a student doesn't require perfection—it requires intentionality. It's about choosing God's natural remedies over the world's quick fixes. It's about realizing that the same God who cares about your spiritual salvation also cares about your physical restoration.

As Ellen G. White so powerfully put it: **"The harmonious action of all the powers of the body and mind results in health."** So whether I'm studying science, memorizing Bible verses, or helping around the house, I'm learning to live a life that is balanced, natural, and fully alive.

**For homeschool students seeking balance, I recommend starting with three daily commitments:*



1) Begin the day with God, outdoors if possible.



2) Eat something grown, not manufactured.



3) Move your body daily—even if it's just 10 minutes of activity between lessons.

Simple, biblical, natural.



Vegan Lemon Blueberry Ricotta Pancakes

Ingredients

Sweet Lemon Ricotta

- 1/2 block extra firm tofu
- 1 tsp lemon zest
- Juice of 1 lemon
- 2 tsp sugar
- 1/4 tsp salt

Pancakes

- 3 Tbsp flax meal
- 9 Tbsp water
- 2 cups all-purpose unbleached flour
- 4 tsp baking powder
- 1 tsp salt
- 1 tsp cardamom or cinnamon powder
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 2 cups soy/almond milk
- 2 tsp lemon juice
- 1 tsp vanilla
- 1 Tbsp Lemon zest
- 1/4 cup olive oil
- 3/4 cup blueberries



Directions



1. First, make the flax egg. In a medium mixing bowl, add the flax and water. Whisk and set aside to thicken.
2. Next, make the buttermilk. In a small bowl/cup, combine the milk and lemon juice to create vegan buttermilk. Lightly stir and set aside.
3. Make the vegan ricotta. Squeeze as much liquid out of the tofu as possible. (You may wrap in paper towel and squeeze over the sink) then place all the ricotta ingredients in a food processor and process for a minute or so scraping down the sides as needed until the ricotta is smooth and creamy. Set aside or place in the fridge until ready to use.
4. In a large mixing bowl, add the flour, baking powder, salt, cardamom and sugar. Whisk to combine. Set aside.
5. In a separate bowl, add vanilla, lemon zest, oil, flax egg and buttermilk. Whisk to fully combine.
6. Then, add 1/2 cup of the vegan ricotta to the wet mixture, and stir. You don't need to combine fully, just fold in so you still have creamy pockets of ricotta.
7. Pour the wet ingredients into the dry ingredients and stir to combine. Once everything is fully incorporated, fold the blueberries into the batter.
8. Heat a skillet or griddle and spray with nonstick spray. Add as much batter as you like (depending on how large you want them). Now, you can add a little more ricotta into the pancakes if you like by adding a few drops around the pancake while it cooks on one side. Cook for a few minutes, then flip when ready. Cook for a few more minutes until cooked fully through.
9. Repeat until all the pancakes are cooked! Serve with maple syrup or blueberry sauce!



Honey BBQ Cauliflower Wings & Vegan Blue Cheese Dip

Ingredients

Cauliflower Wings:

- 1 large head cauliflower
- Oil spray
- 1/2 cup all-purpose unbleached flour
- 2/3 cup plant-based milk
- 1 tsp garlic powder
- 1 tsp onion powder
- 1/2 tsp salt
- 1/2 cup 4C Crumbs gluten free plain breadcrumbs
- 1/2 - 1 cup BBQ sauce
- 1/3 cup honey

Blue Cheese Dip:

- 1/4 Block Extra firm tofu, (drained & squeezed dry)
- 1 cup Vegan mayo
- 1 Tbsp Lemon juice
- 1 tsp Onion powder
- 1 tsp Garlic powder
- 1 tsp fresh Dill (or dried)
- 1 tsp Tahini (optional)
- 1 tsp Salt

Directions



1. Remove the leaves from the cauliflower and cut the rest into individual florets (1-2 bites each). Spray a parchment lined baking sheet with oil.
2. Place the breadcrumbs in a separate bowl.
3. In a mixing bowl, combine the flour, milk, garlic and onion powder and salt. Mix thoroughly with a fork until smooth. Thoroughly toss the cauliflower florets in the batter, then lift up each piece of cauliflower in turn, allow any excess batter to drip off. Roll in the breadcrumbs (add more breadcrumbs if necessary).
4. Place breaded pieces of cauliflower on a parchment lined baking sheet.
5. Bake the cauliflower at 375°F for 20 minutes, flipping at least once, until crispy on all sides. To cook in your air fryer, add florets to the air fryer basket in a single layer. Cook at 375°F for 10 to 12 minutes until crispy.
6. While the cauliflower is baking, add the BBQ sauce and honey to another bowl, and mix well to combine. Set aside.
7. Make the blue cheese. Whisk all the ingredients together except the tofu. Make sure the water is all pressed out of the tofu, then crumble really well so it looks like cheese crumbles and stir into the dip. Set aside.
8. As before, coat each piece of baked cauliflower in the honey BBQ sauce, allow the excess to drip off, and return to the baking tray (or use a clean baking tray, if needed). Bake for a further 15 minutes, until the cauliflower wings are hot and sticky. You can baste them with a little more honey BBQ sauce after 10 minutes, if you like.
9. Serve immediately as an appetizer with blue cheese dip or dinner with rice or preferred side dish.





Vegan Strawberry Cupcakes

Ingredients:

Strawberry Puree

- 10-12 medium/large strawberries

Cupcakes:

- 1/2 cup + 2 tablespoons unsweetened soy milk
- 1 tsp lemon juice
- 1/2 cup softened vegan butter
- 3/4 cup sugar
- 1 teaspoon pure vanilla extract
- 1/3 cup reduced strawberry puree
- 4-5 drops red or pink vegan friendly food coloring (optional)
- 1 1/2 cups unbleached cake flour
- 2 teaspoons baking powder
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 3/4 cup diced strawberries
- 12 whole strawberries, for topping each cupcake

Strawberry Buttercream Frosting

- 3 tablespoons reduced strawberry puree, completely cooled
- 3/4 cup vegan butter, slightly softened
- 3 cups powdered sugar
- 1/4 teaspoon pure vanilla extract
- 3-4 drops red or pink vegan friendly food coloring (optional)

Directions

Strawberry Puree

1. Rinse and hull the strawberries. Using a food processor or blender, puree them.
2. Pour the puree into a small pot and simmer for 25-30 minutes, until it reduces somewhat. You will need 1/3 cup for the cupcake batter, and 3 tablespoons for the frosting. Allow it to cool for a few minutes before adding to cake batter and let it cool completely for the frosting. I like to stick it in the freezer to speed this up.



Strawberry Puree:

1. Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F and line a cupcake pan with liners. Spray the liners with oil.

Make the cupcakes:

1. Combine the soy milk and lemon juice (to make buttermilk). Stir a little, then set aside.
2. Using an electric hand mixer or a stand mixer, cream together the softened butter and sugar until creamy. Mix in the buttermilk mixture, vanilla, reduced strawberry puree and food coloring, if using.
3. Stop the mixer, and add the cake flour, baking powder and salt to the wet ingredients. Mix on low speed until just combined, scraping the bowl as needed. Fold in the diced strawberries, gently.
4. Divide the batter evenly in the liners (3/4 full) and bake for 20-22 minutes until a toothpick inserted comes out clean. Allow them to cool in the muffin tray for 10 minutes, then transfer to a wire rack to cool completely before frosting.

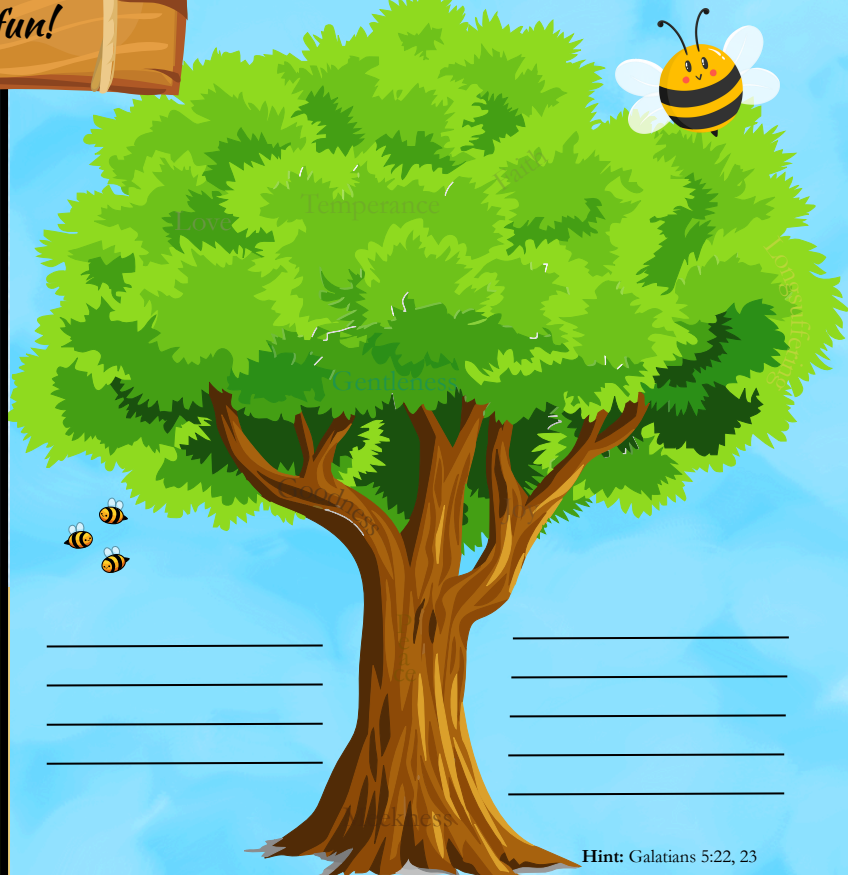
Did You Know?

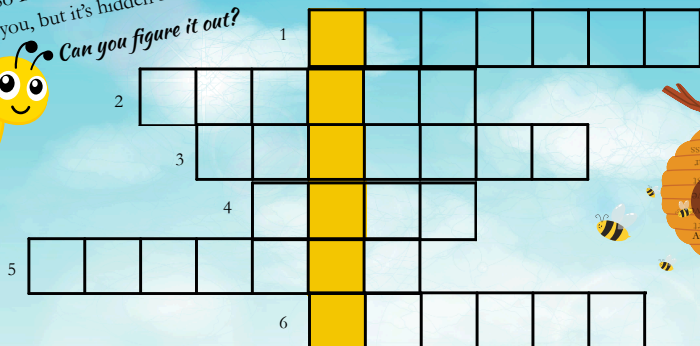

Elizabeth thanked God because the door had seemed glued shut, and it wouldn't have opened if it weren't for Elizabeth's little faith that saved them that night.



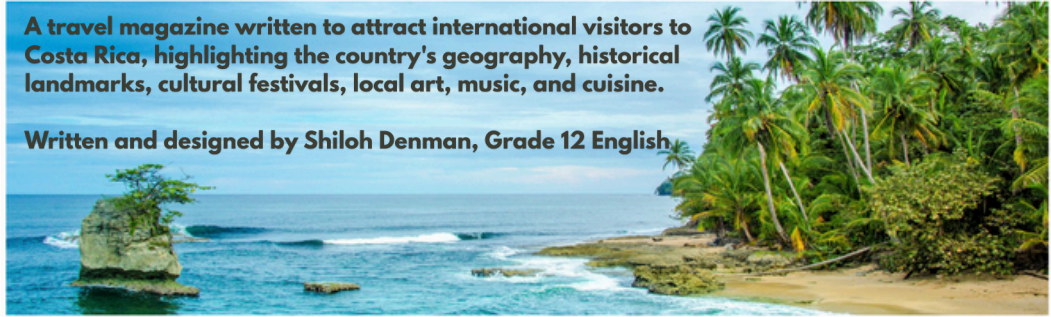

In the distance, towering volcanos dominate the landscape, and from far away you hear the roar of rushing waterfalls cascading into picturesque pools. That is Costa Rica, located in Central America and sandwiched between Nicaragua and Panama. Costa Rica is a popular tourist destination, and for good reason. Keep reading to find out what makes Costa Rica the rugged adventurer's perfect vacation spot!

Sky-High Rainforests

Costa Rica is known for its protected natural wonders. Many of those include vast rainforests, but not all rainforests are the same. Costa Rica has six different kinds, including tropical and cloud forests. The Monteverde Cloud Forest, spanning roughly 25,000 acres, is renowned for its astounding biodiversity, with over 2,500 plant species.

Many incredible creatures call this forest home, including sloths, toucans, and jaguars. You can get a bird's eye view of this amazing biological reserve by walking on hanging bridges or ziplining through the canopy. Tickets to enter are roughly \$30, but tours will cost more, ranging from \$30-\$80, with ziplines costing roughly the same.



Sunny Beaches

If racing through a cloud-covered canopy isn't for you, maybe visit Costa Rica's coastline to experience the perfect tropical beach paradise. Costa Rica is surrounded on both sides by the Pacific and Caribbean oceans, so there are plenty of options. Surfing, fishing, snorkeling, whale watching, and kayaking are all popular water activities, but relaxing on the beach is a good choice too. There are many beaches to choose from depending on what kind of vibe you're looking for. Manuel Antonio Beach is one of the most popular beaches in the country. To get to it, you have to hike thirty minutes through the Manuel Antonio National Park, where you might see monkeys if you're lucky. Tamarindo Beach is known for its waves, making it popular with surfers, and Whale's Tail on Punta Uvita is home to humpback whales and sea turtles at certain times of the year. It also features an expansive coral reef if your up for snorkeling. In Costa Rica, there's a perfect beach trip for everyone.

Sleeping Giants

One of the most popular tourist activities is hiking up a volcano. Costa Rica has 61 dormant or extinct volcanos and 6 active ones. Arenal Volcano is the most popular one, perfectly cone-shaped, dormant since 2010, and surrounded by local coffee plantations. If you're looking for something a bit more exciting, Poas is one of the world's largest active volcanos, with sulfur emissions and two crater lakes, one of them being one of the world's most acidic lakes. The Rincon de la Vieja Volcano is the largest and most active volcano in the Guanacaste region, complete with hot springs, waterfalls, and bubbling mud pools. There are even parks where you can book a day slipping down water slides into the naturally heated pools below, as well as other amenities such as horseback riding, garden tours, and hot mud baths. An all-day pass at Vandara, one such park, can range from \$65-\$95.



Where to Stay

So now you've heard all the amazing adventures Costa Rica has to offer, and you're already planning your next vacation. The best time to visit is between December and April, during the dry season. But where to stay? While the country is known for catering to more wealthy adventurers, there are plenty of places to stay while keeping within the budget. Volcano Lodge, as the name suggests, is located near the base of Arenal Volcano and features botanical gardens, cold and hot water swimming pools, hiking trails, and a local cuisine restaurant. Prices range from \$230-\$280 per night. If you're more drawn to the ocean, Nandel Beach Resort is situated right off the Pacific coast, where you can fish, kayak, swim, snorkel, and kite surf. You can rent a room or suite, with prices ranging from \$116 to \$177. For an authentic rainforest experience, look no further than Valle Escondido Nature Reserve Hotel and Farm, a small but unique hotel located right outside the Monteverde Forest. You can book day and night tours, explore the reserve, and take a tour of the on-site organic farm that supplies local restaurants. The average price is \$161. Of course, do your own research to find the perfect spot for you and your family to stay.

With an adventure for everyone, Costa Rica is the perfect tropical getaway, whether you're looking for peace and relaxation or high-stakes adrenaline-fueled fun. 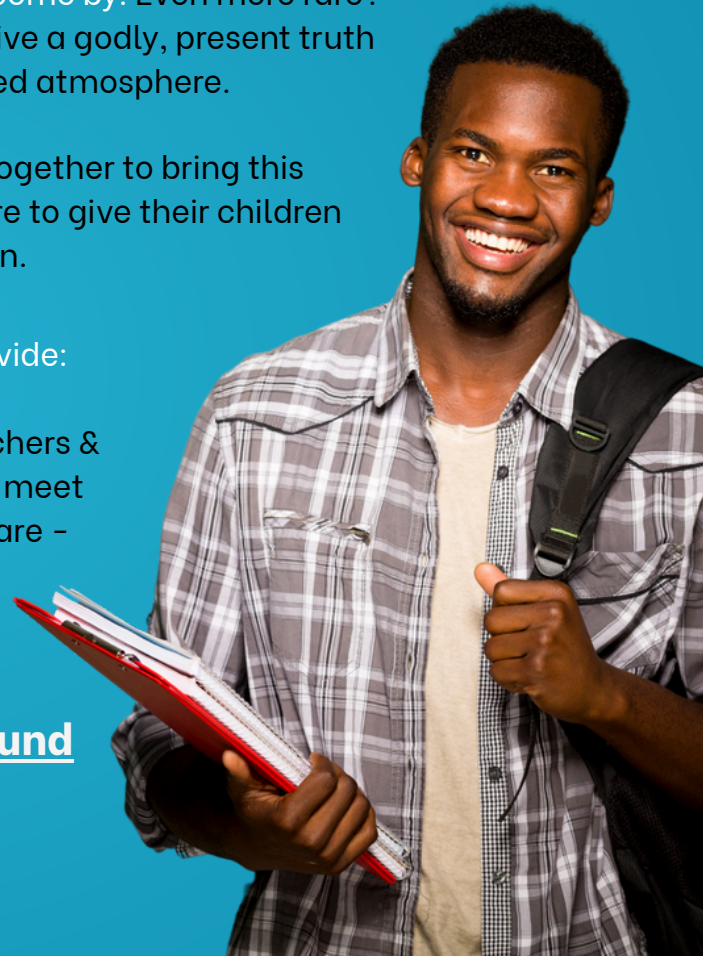
